- Provide resource coordination and comprehensive case management.
- Provide education and guidance in navigating the court process.
- Provide financial literacy and budgeting consultation as well as music-base reunification interventions through our community partners.
- Provide assistance in successfully completing case plans developed by DCBS for birth parents.
- Collaboration with court systems in working toward timely reunification.
- Provide 24/7 support including an on-call line for after-hours emergencies.
